



CNS Config Retrieve Enhancement with Retry and Interval

The Cisco Networking Services (CNS) Config Retrieve Enhancement with Retry and Interval feature adds new functionality to the **cns config retrieve** command enabling you to specify the retry interval and an amount of time in seconds to wait before attempting to retrieve a configuration from a trusted server. The number of retries is restricted to 100 to prevent the configuration agent from indefinitely attempting to reach an unreachable server. Use the keyboard combination **Ctrl-Shift-6** to abort the **cns config retrieve** command.
