The commands in this chapter apply to the Cisco MDS 9000 Family of multilayer directors and fabric switches. All commands are shown here in alphabetical order regardless of command mode. See "About the CLI Command Modes" section on page 1-3 to determine the appropriate mode for each command.

## job name

To assign a job to a command schedule, use the **job name** command. To remove the job, use the **no** form of the command.

job name job-name

no job name job-name

### **Syntax Description**

Specifies the job name for the command schedule to run.

Scheduler schedule configuration submode.

## **Command History**

## **Usage Guidelines**

To use this command, the command scheduler must be enabled using the scheduler enable command.

You can configure multiple jobs in a command schedule.

## **Examples**

The following example shows how to specified the job for a command schedule:

switch# config terminal
switch(config)# scheduler schedule name MySchedule
switch(config-schedule)# job name MyJob

#### Related Commands

Command	Description
scheduler enable	Enables the command scheduler.
scheduler schedule name	Configures a schedule for the command scheduler.
show scheduler	Displays scheduler information.
