**delete account**

# delete account

**delete account**

<b>Syntax Description</b>	<b>delete account</b>	Removes the <i>account-name</i> .
---------------------------	-----------------------	-----------------------------------

<b>Command Modes</b>	Admin Command privilege level: 4 Allowed during upgrade: No
----------------------	---

<b>Command History</b>	<b>Release</b>	<b>Modifications</b>
	1.2	This command was first documented.

<b>Usage Guidelines</b>	Use this command to delete an administrator account.

<b>Examples</b>	admin: <b>delete account</b>

## delete dns

**delete dns *ip-address***

<b>Syntax Description</b>	<i>ip-address</i>	Represents the IP address of the DNS server that you want to delete.
---------------------------	-------------------	--

<b>Command Modes</b>	Admin
	Command privilege level: 1
	Allowed during upgrade: No

<b>Command History</b>	<b>Release</b>	<b>Modifications</b>
	1.2	This command was first documented.

<b>Usage Guidelines</b>	This command allows you to delete the IP address for a DNS server. The system asks whether you want to continue to execute this command.
-------------------------	---



If you continue, this command causes a temporary loss of network connectivity.

<b>Examples</b>	admin: <b>delete dns 192.0.2.0</b>

<b>Related Commands</b>	<b>Command</b>	<b>Description</b>

**delete process**

# delete process

**delete process *process-id* [force | terminate | crash]**

---

**Syntax Description**

process-id	Represents the process ID number.
<b>force</b>	Tells the process to stop.
<b>terminate</b>	Tells the operating system to terminate the process.
<b>crash</b>	Crashes the process and produces a crash dump.

---

**Command Modes**

Admin

Command privilege level: 1

Allowed during upgrade: Yes

---

**Command History**

Release	Modifications
1.2	This command was first documented.

**Usage Guidelines**
**Note**

This command allows you to delete a particular process.

---

Use the **force** option only if the command alone does not delete the process and use the **terminate** option only if **force** does not delete the process.

---



---

**Examples**

```
admin: delete process 192.0.2.0
```
