Cisco Systems[®] announces the end-of-sale and end-of life dates for the Cisco SB 100 Series Small-Business Routers. The last day to order the Cisco SB 100 Series Small-Business Routers is December 29, 2007. Customers with active service contracts will continue to receive support from the Cisco Technical Assistance Center (TAC) as shown in Table 1 of the EoL bulletin. Table 1 describes the end-of-life milestones, definitions, and dates for the Cisco SB 100 Series Small-Business Routers. Table 2 lists the product part numbers affected by this announcement.

End-of-Life Announcement Date	The date the document that announces the end of sale and end of life of a product is distributed to the general public.	December 29, 2006
End-of-Sale Date	The last date to order the product through Cisco point-of-sale mechanisms. The product is no longer for sale after this date.	
Last Ship Date: HW, OS SW	The last-possible ship date that can be requested of Cisco and/or its contract manufacturers. Actual ship date is dependent on lead time.	March 29, 2008
End of SW Maintenance Releases Date: OS SW	The last date that Cisco Engineering may release any final software maintenance releases or bug fixes. After this date, Cisco Engineering will no longer develop, repair, maintain, or test the product software.	
End of Routine Failure Analysis Date: HW	The last-possible date a routine failure analysis may be performed to determine the cause of product failure or defect.	
End of New Service Attachment Date: HW, OS SW	For equipment and software that is not covered by a service-and- support contract, this is the last date to order a new service-and- support contract or add the equipment and/or software to an existing service-and-support contract.	
End of Service Contract Renewal Date: HW, OS SW	The last date to extend or renew a service contract for the product.	March 25, 2012
Last Date of Support: HW, OS SW	The last date to receive service and support for the product. After this date, all support services for the product are unavailable, and the product becomes obsolete.	December 27, 2012
