For service router and management applications, the customer is encouraged to migrate to a supported Cisco UCS C220 M3 Rack Server configuration (part number UCSC-C220-M3S), operated with the appropriate Cisco Videoscape Distribution Suite for Internet Streaming (VDS-IS) software: part VDSSR-K9 (service router) or VDSMGR-K9 (Content Delivery System Manager).

For streaming applications, the customer may select from a supported Cisco UCS product configuration or an appropriate Cisco Content Delivery Engine 250 model.
